

Monthly Meeting– February 20th Speaker: Scott Harvey



The deadline for entering WOY is November 30, 2019.

The California State Fair Home Wine Competition is accepting home wine between March 18th and April 26th. The competition will be held at Cal Exp on May 18th this year. 







