Monthly Meeting– April 17th Red Wines Roundtable Discussion

Join your fellow Home Winemakers on Wednesday April 17th at 7pm for our Monthly Program upstairs at the Turn Verein located at 3349 J Street in Sacramento. There is additional parking in the back.

This month's meeting is devoted to the evaluations of each other's wine. A different format rolled out last year by Paul Baldwin that I fondly call, The Roundtable.

The goals of this activity are:

Help more members get to know each other and have fun Learn what is expected on the competition judging sheet and how to use it

Help members express wine characteristics and faults Increase participation in wine exhibits and sharing wine to the club

This month everyone needs to bring a bottle of red wine you have made, with preference for this year's wine, if that is not possible previous year or last resort a commercial wine. If you are a couple one bottle is fine unless you feel so inclined to each bringing a bottle. Don't forget a wine glass for sampling wines.

Tell your fellow Winemakers what wine you brought, wines you have made before, what's your favorite wine. Each person should talk about their winemaking journey with this wine. You can use the Evaluation form on the SacHomeWine.com website, on the home page you will find a link to the Wine Evaluation Form on the right side of the page. We will be reviewing the judging sheet for each of the wines brought to The Round Table.

This is your opportunity to share your wine with members and learn about how wines are judged using the judging sheet. And best of all with the Roundtable format you will be able to share your wine while getting to know other members and have fun! If you haven't yet prepared your bottle do so without adding sulfites.

The 2019 home wine competition season is well underway. Bottleshock has been judged and the awards ceremony is scheduled for May 2nd. Congrats to SHW members who placed in the money!!

Bear in mind that if you wish to enter the Sacramento Home Winemakers Rex Johnston Winemaker of the Year competition for 2019, you must have entered at least two separate and dis-



tinct wines (as far as variety and harvest year) in both the 2019 Sacramento Home Wine Jubilee Competition and the California State Fair, and one other recognized 2019 home wine competition. The deadline for entering WOY is November 30, 2019. If you hear about other home wine competitions, let me know and I will include it in this article next month (donnab1045@gmail.com).

California State Fair Home Wine Competition

The California State Fair Home Wine Competition is accepting home wine between March 18th and April 23rd. (**Not April 26th as was reported in this column last month**). The competition will be held at Cal Expo on May 18th this year. For more information e-mail coordinators at <u>homewine@calexpo.com</u>. Registration information is now available at <u>www.castatefair.org</u> SHW will be involved once again in assisting with the pick up of entries at specified drop off locations. With the spring weather comes the annual Sacramento Home Winemaker's club-only competition, known as the Jubilee. This year's competition judging is scheduled for June 1st, with the results revealed the next day at our annual picnic, on June 2nd. (See the May newsletter for registration for the Sunday Picnic and Awards Ceremony).

Entries are judged blindly by experienced home wine judges outside of our membership. Entries are one bottle, and the first entry is free. Subsequent entries are \$8.00 each.

Entries will be accepted at the April 17th monthly meeting, and at drop off locations through May 7th.

So, why should I enter my home wine? Drum roll please!

Reason 10: I have never entered a wine in competition!

Reason 9: My wife/husband/partner tasted this wine and they really, really like it. In fact, it is almost gone!

<u>*Reason 8:*</u> I entered this wine in another competition and it won a gold, silver or bronze metal.

Reason 7: I am very proud of this wine. I took great care in its making, and I want to have some objective feedback.

Reason 6: I am not proud of this wine. I did something very, very wrong and I need feedback!
